Meeting structure

- Each CoP meeting starts with background and essential information about the responsibility to be discussed
- The group unpacks the responsibility using one of a variety of engagement techniques (breakout rooms, Padlet, etc.)
- Small groups share summaries of discussions, themes and connections are identified, remaining issues or questions are documented
- The group identifies key points from the discussion to document in meeting notes, chooses the topic for the next CoP meeting, and lists relevant action items

Discussion: how the framework is organized

- There is still a need for discussion about the basics of the Foundational Public Health Responsibilities, such as navigating the framework visual or what tools need to be developed
- Buy-in and understanding of FPHR from staff, board, and other partners is still a big concern; all of us need to find clarity on the ultimate goal of transformation and how it will affect our communities; is this the “one” or just another transient initiative or paradigm
- The framework gives us a basic language, and we need to consider the other ways responsibilities are organized (such as the 10 Essential Services) and identify excellent messengers for this work

- Research setting up a space for resources that can help us share ideas between CoP meetings
