The Office of Equity in Procurement (OEP) provides the best value in state administrative services by successfully connecting small and diverse businesses with state contracting opportunities to help strengthen the state's small business economy.

The OEP team helps ensure greater equity in state contracting and construction. Through the state's Small Business Procurement Program, OEP works to assist small businesses with the process of becoming certified, promotes opportunities to do business with the state, and provides assistance to small businesses owned by women, minorities, people with substantial physical disabilities, veterans, and businesses located in economically disadvantages areas of Minnesota as they seek state contracts.

Targeted Group Businesses

- Targeted Group businesses are owned and operated by minorities, women, and people with substantial physical disabilities.

Economically Disadvantaged

Businesses

- ✓ Economically Disadvantaged businesses are located, or the owner resides, in parts of Minnesota that have high unemployment and/or low median income.
- ✓ The application for certification is available at <u>https://sbcp.mn.gov</u>.
- Once certified, you're eligible for up to six percent preference on state purchases and contracts. You'll be listed in the state's Directory of Certified Vendors, listed online at

Veteran-Owned Businesses

- ✓ Verify your status as a veteran or a veteran with a service-connected disability.
- To do this, you'll need to complete an online request for a Veteran Status Verification with the Minnesota Department of Veterans Affairs at <u>https://gibill.mn.gov/Home</u>.
- ✓ To complete the online form, you'll need your DD 214 and, if applicable, your summary of benefits letter from the US Department of Veterans Affairs (USVA).
- ✓ Alternatively, Minnesota also accepts federal verification from SBA. Send OEP a copy of your <u>https://veterans.certify.sba.gov/</u> verification and work with us to confirm Minnesota as your principal place of business.

- Once verified, apply to be certified as a veteran-owned business.
- ✓ The application for certification is available at <u>https://sbcp.mn.gov</u>.
- Once certified, you're eligible for up to six percent preference on state purchases and contracts.
- ✓ You'll be listed in the state's Directory of Certified Vendors, listed online at <u>https://mn.gov/admin/osp/government/procur</u> <u>egoodsandgeneralservices/tgedvo-directory/</u>.
