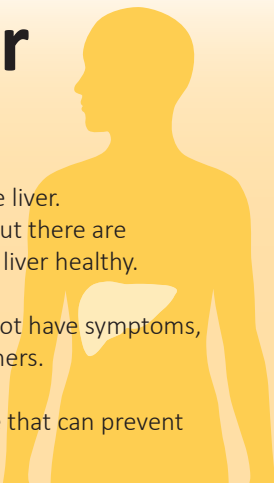









Get tested for Hepatitis B






-  Hepatitis B is a virus that attacks the liver. Hepatitis B can cause liver cancer, but there are treatments that can help keep your liver healthy.
-  People with hepatitis B usually do not have symptoms, but they can pass the disease to others.
-  There is a safe and effective vaccine that can prevent hepatitis B.

Hepatitis B is spread from:

-  Mother to baby during childbirth
-  Coming in contact with blood from a person with hepatitis B
-  Sexual contact
-  Sharing personal care items like a razor, toothbrush, or nail clippers

Hepatitis B is NOT spread by:

-  Sharing food or eating utensils
-  Casual contact like hugging, kissing or holding hands
-  Water or air

Who should be tested for hepatitis B:

- Pregnant women
- People who live with someone who has hepatitis B
- People born in areas where hepatitis B is more common, such as Africa or Asia
- People whose parents are from an area where hepatitis B is common, such as Africa or Asia
