MLS Laboratory Update: Discontinuation of Arbovirus Testing for the 2024 Season

DECEMBER 16, 2024

Purpose of this Message:

To notify clinical laboratory partners that arboviral testing services at the Minnesota Department of Health-Public Health Laboratory (MDH-PHL) will be ending for the season.

Action Item:

Inform all applicable personnel in your facility that testing for endemic arboviruses is not currently available at MDH-PHL.

Background:

With the coming of winter, surveillance for arboviral diseases in Minnesota, including Powassan virus (POW), has ended for 2024. Ticks become dormant when temperatures drop below 40 degrees Fahrenheit and generally become active after 2-3 days above 45 degrees. Mosquitoes prefer temperatures above 50 degrees Fahrenheit. Two great reasons to embrace winter in Minnesota. Specimens received at MDH-PHL after 12/16/2024 will not be tested for POW.

In summary:

- Testing for Powassan virus and mosquito-borne viruses for the 2024 season will end 12/16/2024
- MDH will resume testing for Powassan virus when temperatures are consistently above 40° F (estimated to be mid-March 2025)
