•	nystagmus—repetitive movement of the eyes			
•	persistent head tilt			
5.	Screener observes eyes using the W-I-P-L acronym			
•	Whites—the schlera should be a shade of white without discoloration or growth

1	Iris—the iris should be shaped in a complete circle and the color of the iris should be the same in both eyes			
•	P upil—the pupils should be clear and dark, equally sized and circular in shape. No cloudiness or white discoloration should be visible			
•	Lids and Lashes—the pupil should be fully visible when the eyelids are open; the lid should rest flush against the surface of the eye; there should be no redness or signs of discharge along the eyelid margins or signs of a sty; lashes should be present on upper and lower lids; lashes should turn out; normal blinking pattern should be present.

6.	Screener clearly identifies PASS criteria: Normal appearance of all parts of the external eye.			
7.	Screener clearly identifies REFER criteria for any noted abnormalities of the external eye:			
•	Immediate referral to eye care provider if a white pupil (leukoria) is observed			
•	Referral of abnormal eye positioning, nystagmus, persistent head tilt, lashes turn in, schlera are not a shade of white, irises are different colors or are not shaped in a complete circle, pupils are not equally sized or are not circular in shape			
•	Stop screening if signs of infection are present (e.g., redness, drainage, crusting); refer to health care provider; reschedule vision screening.
