## Accessing MDH e-Licensing System

#### New establishments

If you want to open a body art establishment in the State of Minnesota, you will need to complete the Body Art Establishment Application online at the MDH e-Licensing System.

This is for establishments and temporary events.

Different than the Body Art Technician Licensing System.


## Select the application type (1/2)




## Page Review (2/2))



#### Each page may also:

- Inform you if the information is required (by \* symbol).
- Have a link to the statute requiring the information.

#### Attachment changes:

- Zoning Clearance by Jurisdiction: Must be signed by all local jurisdictions and uploaded to complete the application.
- Forms: Applicants must attest that the disclosure and authorization and consent forms will be used and contain all required items in the statute.



## After application has been submitted (1/4)

- 1. MDH staff will review your application.
- 2. If your application meets all the requirements, you will receive an email from MDH informing you to log into your account and print your license.
- 3. MDH staff will contact you via the eLicensing System if there are questions about the application.
- 4. MDH can also "reopen" application sections if clarifications are needed.
- 5. Applicants can also track applications through the eLicensing System.


## After application has been submitted (2/4)

 Under "My Account" click "Applications".


## After application has been submitted (3/4)


## After application has been submitted (4/4)

## If application has been approved




Print license from the e-Licensing System:

Please note: Temporary event permits can also be printed, but the permit is not valid until signed by MDH evaluator.



## Claiming a record (1/2)




- Only for those who currently have a body art establishment license.
- Claim codes were emailed to operators in December.
- Important to claim so that you will receive renewal notices moving forward.

## Claiming a record (2/2)




- Enter the claim code from the email sent.
- Click "Submit".
- You will want to follow the prompts on the pages to update your account information.

## Updating applicant information (1/2)




 Update information as needed by going into "Profile" and clicking "Edit Profile."

## Updating applicant information (2/2)



- Make changes (including "Reset Password") and click "Save".
- Important for MDH to have all correct and updated information for an applicant/licensee.

## Multiple Owners



- If there are multiple owners for an establishment, each owner can have access.
- This can be done by granting access to guests under "Application Information" once the application has been submitted or the record has been claimed.

Q1: If our shop is in Minneapolis and there's an event outside of the city will there any hiccups since we don't have a Minnesota State Establishment License?

A1: No, you can apply for a temporary event license for an event that will occur within MDH jurisdiction. The establishment license # field on the application is not required.

**Q2:** I haven't received the claim code. Who do I reach out to for that?

**A2:** If you need your claim code, e-mail <a href="mailto:health.ba@state.mn.us">health.ba@state.mn.us</a> with your establishment name and owner name.

## Q & A (2/3)

Q3: Is the claim code only for body art establishments?

A3: Yes, the claim code is for licensed body art establishments only.

**Q4:** Are the recordings for these meetings posted anywhere?

A4: The slides presented today will be posted to our website in the coming weeks.

The below is in response to an email received:

**Q4:** Are the laws that have to do with body art on the state level coming from a committee through our representatives? What is the committee called and where can I access what representatives are part of it? Do you know if any tattooers or piercers are working with those representatives or consulted by the committee? Are there any lobbyists representing the tattoo artists on the sate level? **A4:** While the department can draft legislative proposals, most bills are brought forth by an outside party to their legislator. Information relating to the legislative process was presented by a member of the HRD legislative team in the September 2024 industry meeting. The topics of interest brought up by the industry focused on the fee (establishment and technician), separation of licensure for tattooist and permanent makeup, apprenticeship, and exceptions for licensure.

Currently, the division is not aware of a lobbyist or anyone in the industry working with a representative/senator to propose statutory language change. HRD would encourage you and your colleagues to connect with your local representative/senator. These are the individuals who can champion and move your recommendations forward.

Health related topics are covered in the Senate Health and Human Services Committee and the House Health Finance and Policy Committee. You can find your legislator here: Minnesota State Legislature (https://www.leg.mn.gov/).
