CMS 1135 Waiver Update

- On October 5, 2022, CMS granted Minnesota an extension to the 1135 Waiver
- Waiver will expire as the PHE ending May 11, 2023, per Biden administration
- Nurse aides who wish to continue working after the waiver expires must pass the nurse aide exam by September 10, 2023

4th Knowledge Test Update





4th Knowledge Test

- October 3, 2022-March 31, 2023
- 140 out of 5,186 candidates (2.9%) completed the 4th test attempt
- Passing rate of 47%
- 66 nurse aides added to nurse aide workforce



Top Test Areas for Improvement





Top Knowledge Test Areas for Improvement

- Digestion
- Disease Process
- Moving
- State Tested
- Oral Care





Digestion

- Digestive process
- 64% missed





Disease Process



- Signs of common chronic conditions
- 60% missed



Moving

- Moving/positioning a resident in bed
- Proper body and bed positions
- 52% missed



State Tested

- Individuals must complete testing within 24 months of training program completion date
- This information is identified in the MN Candidate Handbook in numerous areas
- 58% missed



Oral Care

- Providing oral care to residents in a variety of situations or conditions
- Conditions range from residents able to consume food and drink orally, to end of life cares or comatose resident
- Frequency of providing oral care
- 54% Missed



Top Skills Test Areas for Improvement

- Transfer Resident from Bed to Wheelchair using a Gait Belt
- Position Resident in Bed on Side
- Perineal Care for a Female and Hand Washing
- Assisting Resident to Ambulate using a Gait Belt
- Vital Signs: Count and Record Resident's Radial Pulse and Respirations (P&R)



Transfer Resident from Bed to Wheelchair using a Gait Belt

- Locks bed brakes to ensure resident's safety- key step
- Provide privacy
- Place call light within reach



Position Resident in Bed on Side

- Repositions resident's arm and shoulder so that the resident is not lying on arm
- Places or adjusts pillow under resident's head for support
- From the working side of the bed gently moves resident's upper body toward self
- From the working side of the bed gently moves resident's hips toward self
- From the working side of the bed gently moves resident's legs toward self



Perineal Care for a Female and Hand Washing

- Places a pad/linen protector under resident's buttocks
- Washes rectal area from front to back- key step
- Pats dry rectal area from front to back
- Dries equipment



Assisting Resident to Ambulate using a Gait Belt

- Provides privacy
- Locks bed brakes to ensure resident's safety-key step




Vital Signs: Count and Record Resident's Radial Pulse and Respirations (P&R)

- Candidate's recorded radial pulse rate is within 4 beats of RN
 Test Observer's recorded rate-key step
- Candidate's recorded respiratory rate is within 2 breaths of the RN Test Observer's recorded rate-key step
- Place call light within reach




Skills Review





Mandatory First Tasks



- Handwashing skillimbedded in four skills
- Candidates will perform one of the four skills as a mandatory first task



Mandatory First Tasks (cont)

- Assist resident with use of bedpan, measure and record urinary output with handwashing
- Catheter care for female resident with handwashing
- Donn PPE (gown and gloves), emptying urinary drainage bag, measure and record urine output and remove PPE with handwashing
- Perineal care for female resident with handwashing



Handwashing Steps

Turn on water.

Wet hands and wrists thoroughly.

Apply soap to hands.

Rub hands together using friction with soap.

Scrub/wash hands together for at least twenty (20) seconds with soap.

Scrub/wash with interlace fingers pointing downward with soap.

Wash all surfaces of hands with soap.

Wash wrists with soap.

Clean fingernails by rubbing fingertips against palms of the opposite hand.

Rinse fingers, hands and wrists thoroughly under running water with fingers pointed downward.

Starting at the fingertips, dry fingers, hands and wrists on clean paper towel(s).

Discard paper towels to trash container as used.

Turn off faucet with a clean, dry paper towel and discard paper towel to trash container as used, or use knee/foot control to turn off faucet.

Do not re-contaminate hands at any time during the hand washing procedure.



Important Reminders

- Scrub/wash hands together for at least twenty (20) seconds with soap-key step
- Turn off faucet with a clean, dry paper towel and discard paper towel to trash container as used, or use knee/foot control to turn off faucet
- Do not re-contaminate hands at any time during the hand washing procedure-key step



Range of Motion Skills

- Range of motion for one knee and one ankle
- Range of motion for shoulder
- **Key step** in both skills:

Candidate must ask at least once during the ROM exercise if there is/was any discomfort/pain




In-Facility Testing




Two-Server System Links






Test Data Posted

The Nursing Assistant Registry lists nursing assistants who have met Minnesota training and/or testing standards to work in nursing homes and certified boarding care homes. The registry also has information about nursing assistants who have substantiated findings of abuse, neglect, and theft.

This is an online registry. Nursing assistants, employers, and others can check the registry

What has Changed?

- NATCEP Resource and Provisional Application to align more with federal language
- Removed 59 hours of curriculum
- Total clock hours of NATCEP is at least 75 hours
- Supervised practical training (SPT) minimum of 16 hours



What has Changed? (cont)

- Provisional programs must complete first class within 6 months
- NATCEP's must conduct a class at least once in 24 months to continue approval
- RN instructor responsible to enter students in TMU within first 48 hours
- Programs must contact Headmaster and MDH with training program coordinator changes


