

**\*\*Parental Notification for Abortion Services:** According to the <u>Minnesota</u> Attorney General Abortion and Reproductive Health Rights (www.ag.state. <u>mn.us/AbortionRights/)</u>, the statute requiring parental notification by providers who counsel an unemancipated minor on abortion services or who provide abortion services to an emancipated minor has been enjoined by a Minnesota judge and is currently unenforceable.
